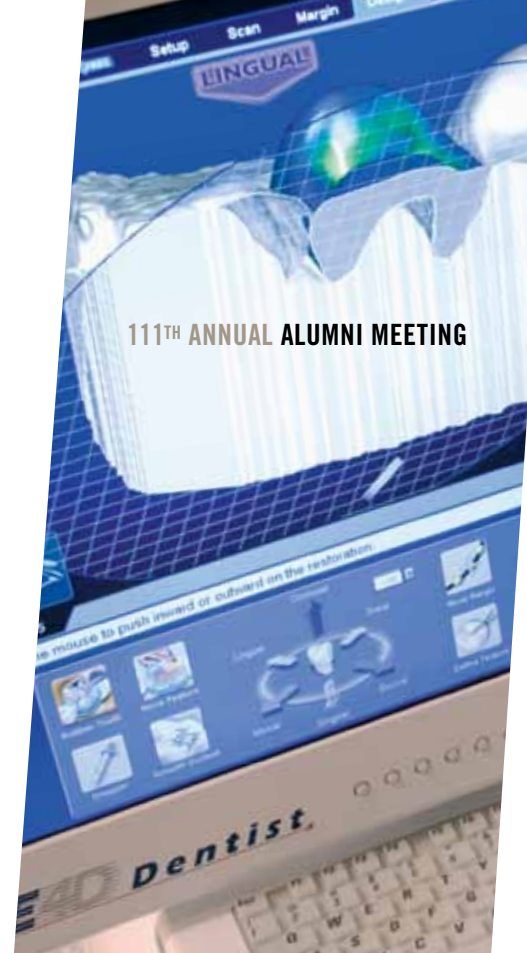

“Systemic Perio – Clinical Applications to Perio/Implant Therapy”

Osteoporosis and osteopenia are systemic conditions that may alter clinical therapy and results. The incidence is on the rise due to millions of women eliminating hormone replacement therapy, increase in lifespan and poor diet of the Millennials and Gen Xers. The dental clinician should be aware of the effects of decreasing bone mineral density (BMD) on their periodontal/implant patients and need to alter therapy. New literature with regard to decreasing BMD and the effects on alveolar bone and tooth loss will be introduced. In light of recent warnings of “osteonecrosis,” the clinician should also be aware of the effects of long term IV bisphosphonate therapy.
