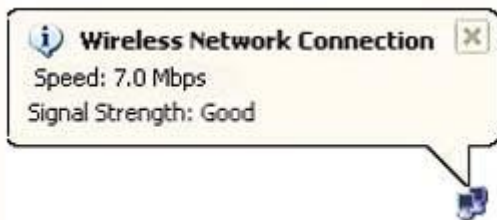


Quick Access to the PACIFIC Dental School's Wireless Network

If you have *previously* connected to the PACIFIC wireless network you *may* see a Windows dialog box appear from the network status icon on the taskbar indicating the computer is connected to PACIFIC and the signal strength. (See image below).

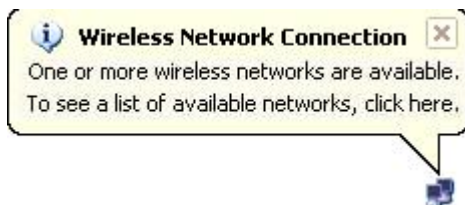


If the Wireless Network Connection dialog box indicates you are connected to PACIFIC, launch your web browser.

If you cannot connect using this method (or do not see the message above) follow the steps below.

A. STEP 1: Detecting the Wireless Network

When an PACIFIC wireless network is detected, a Windows dialog box should automatically appear from the network status icon and report that there are one or more wireless networks available. (See image below).



B. After viewing the message, click once on the network status icon located on the Windows taskbar to view the **Wireless Network Connection Status** window.

Note: If the message in item A above doesn't appear, do the following:

- 1) Right-click on the network status icon on the Windows taskbar.



2) Select **View Available Wireless Networks** from the pop-up menu.



STEP 2: Selecting a Wireless Network

- A. Select **DENTAL WIRELESS** from the list of available wireless networks.
- B. Click on the **Connect** button.



- C. A **Wireless Network Connection Status** dialog box may appear and inform you of your connection and the quality of the connection's signal.



If the dialog box above does *not* appear and you want to see the Wireless Network Connection status, left-click on the network status icon located on the Windows taskbar.
